Medications

Medications shall be prescribed by a licensed health provider.

□Students are **NOT allowed** to carry any medications to school.

(Exemptions will be considered after a medication self-administer agreement form is completed)
□Complete DOE Medication consent forms (signed by parent & health provider)

Head lice

Parents/Guardians will be notified
Parents/guardians must bring child to nurse for clearance.
Live lice, students are NOT allowed to attend to school.

CONTAGIOUS DISEASES

Students are not allowed in school if they have the following symptoms:

Temperature (higher than 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit)
Purulent discharge from eyes or nose
Uncontrolled bouts of coughing
An unidentified skin rash
Vomiting and/ or diarrhea

NOTE

Parents will be notified for child to go home if symptoms are displayed at school. Please notify the school if your child has any contagious disease.

Board Policy 705 Food and Nutrition

- Requirement of GDOE to maintain participation in the USDA food and Nutrition in accordance with the Child Nutrition and WIC Reauthorization Act of 2004. This requires that NO outside food be available to students throughout the school day. NO PARTIES at all during the school day. No "Birthday snacks or cake" will be distributed to students.
- GDOE Approved listing of Snacks and Beverage is available in the Main Office and at school website <u>MAUES@gdoe.net</u> or http://mauelementaryschool.weebly.com/.
- Highly encourage healthy drinks: 100% juice, water, and milk. (Sodas, teas are not recommended).

Toys/Electronics- Toys or any other electronic items are not allowed in school and should be kept at home for safekeeping. The school will not be responsible for any lost or stolen items.

Curriculum-Instruction-Assessment

- Using the Common Core State Standards, our school will focus on English/Language Arts, Science, Social Studies, technology, and character education. Chamorro studies is a required mandated subject.
- Standard Based Grading is used to measure the knowledge and performance of the mastery of skills. Student data are analyzed on a daily basis by the teachers. Teachers will monitor students' progress & provide the necessary interventions needed.

Investigates student referrals

- Ex: If a child exhibits classroom problems, they may be related to health problems, vision, hearing, dental and hyperactivity, physical and emotional difficulty at home.
- Serves as a resource person for coordination with other agencies and community resources
