

Hafa Adai, Parents! With just a few weeks left of school, we still have a lot of work to do! Here is what we're learning in 4<sup>th</sup> quarter:

- READING CCSS 3.RL.1: Ask and answer questions to demonstrate understanding of a text, referring explicitly to the text as the basis for the answers.
- LANGUAGE ARTS CCSS 3.L.1: Demonstrate command of the conventions of standard English grammar and usage when writing or speaking. Explain the function of Contractions and Combining Sentences.
- MATH CCSS 3.OA.3: I can represent and solve problems involving multiplication and division.
- SOCIAL STUDIES GDOE 3.1.1: Describe and explain the significance of traditional food, customs, sport and games, and music of the place they came from with the help of family members or other adults.
- SCIENCE NGSS 4-LS1-1: I can construct an argument that plants, and animals have internal and external structures that function to support survival, growth, behavior, and reproduction.

- Study multiplication and division facts during Spring Break. We will be wrapping up multiplication and division and will take our test when we return from break.

#### Dear Parents,

The end of the school year is fast approaching for our Head Start kids. We have now completed our Insect Studies with our Creative Curriculum and will be introducing our Getting Read for Kindergarten Study! Our next study and Second Step lessons will be focusing on supporting your children for their next journey after Head Start.

#### Topics That We will be Focusing on:

- Learning in Kindergarten
- Riding the Bus in Kindergarten
- Making New Friends in Kindergarten
- How is kindergarten like Head Start? How is it different?

We also encourage you help prepare your child for kindergarten by continuing with scheduled Parent Child Interventions and at home activities that promote school readiness. Here is a glimpse of the Counseling program:

**Monthly** lessons are on-going via google classroom. Have your child join our Counseling google classroom to access our lessons/announcements. Please remind your child/ren to take the survey at the end of the lesson. It has been a year since the pandemic began and we recognize that this might have caused a lot of stress and anxiety for adults and children. We are here to help children and families understand what they can/cannot control. April's lesson will be about "Identifying and Managing Worry".

**Recess with the Counselors** We have it twice a month virtually on Zoom. This is available for ALL models of learning.

**District Wide Assessments** are this month. Below are a few tips to prepare your child for testing the night before and the morning of testing:

- The night before testing, make sure your child(ren) gets enough sleep, so they are physically and mentally prepared on test day.
- **Remove technology temptations** at least 1 hour before sleep. The blue light emitted from devices like computers, smartphones, tablets, and TVs can disrupt the body's ability to drift off.
- Create a cozy cave where the child(ren) sleep(s), if possible. A cool, quiet, and dark room helps children fall asleep more easily. The National Sleep Foundation recommends children ages 6-11 years old sleep 9-11 hours per night.<sup>1</sup>
- The day of testing, make sure your child(ren) eats a balanced breakfast that will fuel them for several hours. If your child(ren) eats breakfast at school, please make sure they arrive no later than 8:00AM to eat before school begins. A balanced breakfast includes a variety of foods:
  - whole grains—whole wheat bread, brown rice, oatmeal
  - protein—eggs, lean meat, tofu, nuts, beans fresh fruits and vegetables
  - low fat dairy—milk, yogurt, cheese
  - Finally, don't forget to verbally remind your child that you believe in their ability to do well and wish them luck!
