The Guam Department of education will be administering the annual district – wide assessment from Monday, March 28, 2022, to Friday, May 13, 2022.

Students will participate in the ACT Aspire and as follows:

Grades 3 -7 : ACT Aspire for Reading, English, and Math (Science only for grades 3&6) Grades 8 -9: PreACT for for Reading, English, and Math (Science only for grade 9) Grade 10 – 11: PreACT

Assessment protocols do not allow for remote testing. Thus, all students participating in the online model of learning will be required and scheduled by their School Site Test Coordinator to be physically present for assessments.

It is important that all students arrive at school on time and ready to start the testing actvitiies . Please assist students by discussing the testing and by sharing the following tips with them:

 $\checkmark \text{Do your best}$ and relax before and during the tests.

- \checkmark Get a good night's sleep before each test date.
- $\checkmark \mbox{Eat}$ a good breakfast and arrive to school on time.

Heads Up! Here are our upcoming skills and topics: <u>READING- Phonics/Phonemic Awareness:</u> Practice reading words with vowel teams Ex. m<u>eat</u>, t<u>oe</u>s, tr<u>ain</u>, <u>boat</u>, etc. Practice reading words with digraphs (sh, ch, wh, th, ph) Ex. shop, cheese, which, teeth, phone, etc. Practice reading words with beginning & ending blends Ex. <u>slide</u>, <u>sn</u>ipped, <u>grill</u>, <u>cr</u>ied, <u>sw</u>ing, <u>gl</u>obe, <u>skunk</u>, sce<u>nt</u>, etc.

<u>READING- Comprehension:</u> After reading with your child, Identify the main idea and key details Ask & Answer reading comprehension questions in a complete sentence

ELA (English & Language Arts)- Grammar: Use irregular verbs in a sentence (oral & written) Ex. eat = ate: I ate my breakfast this morning. come = came: My friends came over to my house yesterday. has = had: We had pizza for dinner last night.

<u>ELA (English & Language Arts)- Writing:</u> I can write a narrative (beginning, middle, end) (write sentences/paragraphs with complete ideas, capitalization and punctuation mark)

<u>MATH: Word Problems</u> I can read & solve 1 to 2 step word problems (addition & subtraction) I can add and subtract 3-Digit numbers with regrouping (carry over & borrowing)
