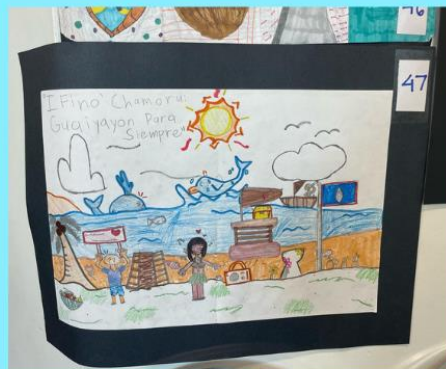

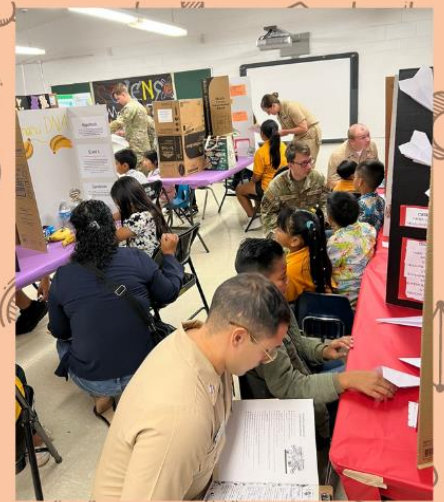

WHAT WE ARE LEARNING:

- **ELA:** Grammar: using irregular verbs in a sentence; using adjectives & adverbs in a sentence; Writing: practice cursive writing
- **MATH:** Add & Subtract 3-digits with regrouping (carry over & borrowing); Solve 1-2 step word problems using money; use data to answer questions; telling time to the hour, half-hour and by the minutes
- **SCIENCE:** Rocks (pebbles, sand & silt FOSS kits); animal habitats
- **SOCIAL STUDIES:** Maps & Globes with Compass Rose; create a map with all of the map parts (title, map key, compass rose)
- **HEALTH:** My Body and ways to stay healthy

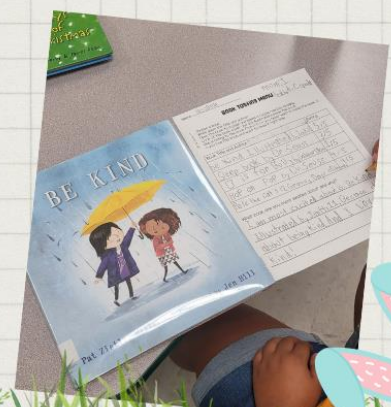
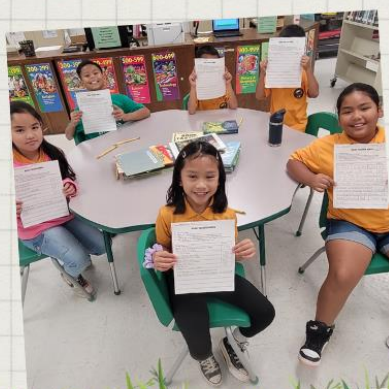

Optimize Brain Power

- Ensure that your child gets **enough sleep** and **eats a healthy breakfast**. It gives them the energy needed for taking tests!



Encourage Good Study Habits and Challenge Critical Thinking Skills

- Review test taking strategies and encourage your child to discuss or explain thought processes to stimulate critical thinking.



Be Informed

- Be aware of the time and dates of the testing periods.
- Get to know the type of test that is being administered and if you have questions, contact the school or teachers to find out more information.



Examine Past Performance and Provide Practice Opportunities

- Examine your child/ren's past performance on tests and identify areas that need improvement.
- Discuss these areas of improvement with your child and aim for activities that target improvement on those skills.
- Simulate test taking by practicing activities with multiple choices, timed reading, and establishing goals to accomplish after each session.



Relax and Be Positive

- Practice relaxation techniques to help your child stay cool and calm during a test!
