As we start the new year 2021, let us look back on 2020 and reflect on all the good things and blessings we had despite this awful pandemic. First, let us be thankful for our health, our families, our friends, our classmates, and our wonderful teachers and school staff who "flew the aircraft while they were building it" so to speak. It was an adventurous ride on the "distance learning" aircraft, and it looks like we will continue with this new normal for a few more months in 2021. So please bear with us, as there will be changes in school, beginning January 19. As you may have already heard in the news, face-to-face instruction will resume after Martin Luther King Jr. Day holiday (Monday, January 18). So, some of your classmates may be returning into the actual classroom and there may be additional changes to classes. There is a proposed new district schedule because of the upcoming face-to-face instruction, and more information about that schedule will be shared with you prior to January 19 once it is confirmed.

2nd Quarter ends on January 7, so please try to complete any unfinished assignments from 2nd quarter by then. Also, some students who were not able to pick up their holiday treats may do so by making arrangements with their teachers.

For students who will be returning to the classroom for face-toface instruction, please keep in mind that you will be grouped according to your last names to maintain social distancing in the classroom, and you will come to school on your scheduled or assigned day. According to the new proposed district schedule, face-to-face instruction will not take place every day. When on campus, it is very important for students to always follow school rules, especially safety protocols, to avoid the spread of Covid-19 infections. We are urging parents to take this matter seriously, to discipline your children to listen to and obey teachers and school authority while on campus, as it is a matter of life and death. Children will need to be screened (e.g., temperature checks) upon entry into campus and must follow classroom safety procedures as well (e.g., handwashing or hand sanitizing, social distance, etc.) If your child cannot and/or refuse to follow the safety protocols on campus, it is recommended that your child learn via online or hard copy; and please keep your child(ren) at home if they are sick. Furthermore, if your child(ren) or anyone in your family have tested positive for Covid-19 prior to returning to campus, please let the school nurse, your teacher, or the principal know. You must get clearance from public health to resume face-to-face instruction. We are hoping for your cooperation in ensuring that you and your child(ren) comply with our school campus safety protocols for everyone's protection against Covid-19. Thank you for your understanding.

We look forward to a successful and healthy 2nd semester of the school year in 2021, and we thank you for your continued support in your child's education. Have a wonderful month of January and Happy Martin Luther King, Jr. Day!





Happy New Year! Let us welcome the New Year with a positive outlook. We are halfway through the school year, and third quarter will start on January 8, 2021. For the New Year, let us continue to encourage our students to focus on their online and hard copy models of learning. Let us also make sure that assignments are completed in a timely manner, and most of all, let us make sure that our students are always present during the assigned lessons. Please be informed that face-to-face learning is scheduled to be implemented on January 19, 2021.

For the third quarter, the following standards will be covered as follows:

Reading

Standard 5.RI.3 – Informational text. Explain the relationships or interactions between two or more individuals, events, ideas, or Concepts.

ELA:

Standard 5.L.2 (a, b, c) — Capitalization, Punctuation Demonstrate command of the conventions of standard English capitalization, punctuation, and spelling when writing. Standard 5.W.1 a-d — Opinion writing Write opinion pieces on topics or texts, supporting a point of view with reason and information.

Math:

Standard 5.NF.1 – Fractions, Add and subtract fractions with unlike denominators (including mixed numbers) by replacing given fractions with equivalent fractions.

Social Studies:

Standard 5.1.1 – History Explain the relationship of the English settlers to the indigenous peoples or Indians in North America, including the differing views on ownership or use of land and the conflicts between them.

Science:

Develop a model using an example to describe the ways the geosphere, biosphere, hydrosphere, and atmosphere.

- Develop a model to describe that matter is made of particles too small to be seen.
- Obtain and combine information about ways individual communities use science ideas to protect Earth.
