Principal's Message

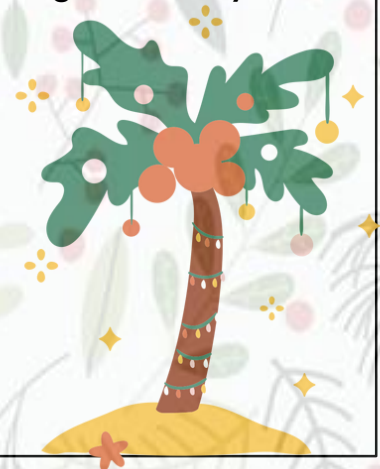
Dear Parents/Guardians,

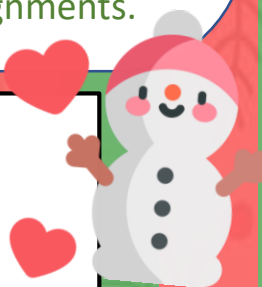
