Principal's Message

Happy New Year and Welcome back Carabaos!

We are looking forward to the rest of the 2022 school year. Despite any given challenge we will continue to plow forward as a strong and hardworking Carabao!

Let us continue to work together to ensure the growth and development of your child(ren) academically, socially and personally.

- 1. Monitor your child(ren)'s schoolwork. Encourage them to read and write daily or simply communicate verbally for about five minutes daily.
- 2. Make sure your children get to school and on time. The more students are in school, the higher their achievement. Children cannot learn if they are not in school. In addition, poor attendance causes students to get behind in their learning and catching up can be very difficult when they return. Being late causes a disruption not only to your child, but also to all of the children in the class. PLEASE make sure your children are walking in our doors by 8:15 a.m. so that they are in their classrooms by 8:30 a.m.
- 3. Reward your children's efforts for trying their best. Rewarding students for high grades is not as effective as rewarding them for their effort. Children want to make their families proud. The best way to motivate effort is to notice it, praise it, and reward it. Rewards are free with just a smile, compliment and encouragement!
- 4. Discuss with your child(ren) how important it is in choosing a career or job for their future. Although your children are only in elementary school, this should start at a young age. For students to be successful in today's world, it takes more than a high school diploma. In the 21st century, almost all students need a formal education or technical training. Having students set higher education, as a target early in their lives will help them set ambitious goals for their academic progress as they proceed through school.
- 5. Finally, be involved! How important is parent involvement in their children's education? Tremendous! Study after study shows that it may be the top factor leading to student success. We are committed here at MAUES to a partnership with all of our families. By working together, we can make a difference!

4. The American Library Association will be announcing the 2022 Newbery and Caldecott Book Award winners. Stay tuned to find out which books take top honors worldwide.


