Before I became an Assistant Principal, I was a Certified Social Studies teacher for thirteen years. I taught in the middle school level for all thirteen years. I started my teaching career at Untalan Middle School in 1997. In 2000, I taught one year at a Magnet School in Houston, Texas. In Houston, I taught sixth grade Social Studies. Then in 2002, I spent five years teaching on the beautiful island of Rota. Teaching in Rota, I was selected as the Teacher of the Year twice. I was also the Accreditation Chairperson, and we received a six year accreditation. In 2007, I taught three years at Benavente Middle School, where I taught seventh grade Social Studies. In 2010, I received my Masters of Education in Admin and Supervision. In the fall of 2010, I became an Assistant Principal at Simon Sanchez High School.










Mes CHamoru (CHamoru Month) is here! The CHamoru teachers have some fun and exciting activities planned for you all! Our theme this year is:




