## \*FIRST GRADE NEWS







In science, the First Graders have been experimenting to learn how plants grow. First, they planted seeds on a paper towel so they could observe how the roots grow. Then, they planted seeds in soil, watered them, and placed them in the sunlight. This was the control group. In just a few days, several plants have already started to grow. For the experimental groups, they watered plants with orange juice or coke instead of water. They also planted seeds in crushed Cheetos, Oreo cookies, and chocolate cake to see if plants really needed the nutrients in soil to grow. So, far, nothing has grown.

Finally, they placed plants in a dark closet to see what happens if plants don't receive any sunlight. The plants grew but they are pale instead of green.

- MATH: Add & Subtract 2-digits with regrouping (carry over & borrowing); Solve 1-2 step word problems
- SCIENCE: Weathering & Erosion; Types of Rocks (intro to rocks)
- SOCIAL STUDIES: Maps & Globes with Compass Rose; Holidays
- HEALTH: My Body and ways to stay healthy
- PE: movement in different ways
- ART: directed drawing activities; arts & crafts
- Music: sing along with songs and chants

## This is THIRDGRADE!

In November, we'll be learning

Reading: Ask and Answer questions to demonstrate understanding of a text referring explicitly to the text as a basis for the answers.

Language: Using irregular plural nouns and abstract nouns.

Math: Fluently add and subtract within 1,000 using strategies and algorithms based on place value, properties of operations, and/or the relationship between addition and subtraction.

Science: Ask questions to determine cause and effect relationships of electric or magnetic interactions between two objects not in contact with each other.

Social Studies: Develop map skills by positioning and labeling the seven

continents and five oceans.


