
Hafa Adai Carabaos!

Reading: I can identify the main topic of a multi-paragraph text as well as the focus of specific paragraphs within the text. (CCSS RI.2.2)

Writing: I can recount and write a detailed narrative story. (CCSS W.2.3)

Science: I can plan and conduct an investigation to describe and classify different kinds of materials.








February in Chamoru is "Fiberu" (Fee-beh-roo). Here is an activity for you to do at home for the month of February.
